general public, the parties and the Arizona Power Plant and Transmission Line Siting Committee ("Committee"), that the Committee will hold a meeting/hearing on the above application that is open to the public at the Tucson Convention Center, 260 S. Church Ave., Tucson, AZ 85701, on Tuesday, November 29, 2016 at 1:00 p.m., and will continue on Wednesday, November 30, 2016 through Friday December 2, 2016, as necessary, at the same location beginning at 9:00 a.m. on each day, unless a tour

is taken. If a tour is taken, it will begin on Thursday, December 1, 2016, at 8:00 a.m. or an alternative date and time set by the Chairman of the Committee ("Chairman"). Public comment may be taken during the hearing at times designated by the Chairman. Public comment also will be taken in a special evening session on Tuesday, November 29, 2016, at 6:00 p.m. at the same location. Unless later ordered by the Chairman, the hearing will adjourn at approximately 5:00 p.m. each day, except on Tuesday, November 29, 2016, when it will continue after 6:00 p.m. for the public comment session.

Thereafter, a hearing in Willcox, Arizona will be held at the Willcox Community Center, 312 W. Stewart Street, Willcox, AZ, 85463, on Monday, December 5, 2016, and will continue on Tuesday, December 6, 2016 through Friday, December 9, 2016, as necessary, at the same location beginning at 9:00 a.m. on each day, unless a tour is taken. If a tour is taken, it will begin on Tuesday, December 6, 2016, at 8:00 a.m. or an alternative date and time set by the Chairman. Public comment may be taken during the hearing at times designated by the Chairman. Public comment also will be taken in a special evening session on Monday, December 5, 2016, at 6:00 p.m. at the same location. Unless later ordered by the Chairman, the hearing will adjourn at approximately 5:00 p.m. each day, except on Monday, December 5, 2016, when it will continue after 6:00 p.m. for the public comment session.

Thereafter, if necessary, a hearing in Tucson, Arizona will be held at the Tucson Convention Center, 260 S. Church Ave., Tucson, AZ 85701, on Monday, December 12, 2016 at 9:00 a.m., and will continue on Tuesday, December 13, 2016 through Friday December 16, 2016, as necessary, at the same location beginning at 9:00 a.m. on each day. Public comment may be taken during the hearing at times designated by the Chairman. Unless later ordered by the Chairman, the hearing will adjourn at approximately 5:00 p.m. each day. The Applicant shall make arrangements for further regular sessions, if needed, and additional public comment sessions, if

needed, on dates, at times, and at places to be determined later.

Additional days for the hearing may be set, and the hearing may conclude earlier or later than anticipated, depending upon the number of parties that intervene, the amount of testimony presented, the amount of public comment, and the time needed for deliberations by the Committee. As a part of the public meeting/hearing, members of the Committee will discuss the potential value of a tour, and, at the discretion of the Chairman, may tour the location of the proposed power plants and transmission lines for the project as set forth above.

At the meeting/hearing, the Committee may consider, discuss, deliberate and/or vote on the matters on the Agenda. Items on the Agenda may be taken in a different order than listed as conditions require:

- 1. Call to Order;
- 2. Roll Call;
- 3. Consideration of and vote upon any requests to intervene;
- 4. Hearing on the application;
- 5. Public Comment at the discretion of the Chairman;
- 6. Discussion of potential value of a tour of the proposed route;
- 7. If it is decided a tour would be valuable, the Committee will meet at the hearing site. The members of the Committee will tour the project. Members of the public may follow the Committee's tour. No testimony or discussion with or between Committee Members about the application or matters relating to the application will take place, except on the record before a court reporter at the designated stops. The Chairman will make any procedural decisions concerning stops at different points of interest;
- 8. Discussion of proposed Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, the Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and conditions to the Certificate of Environmental Compatibility;
- 9. Vote and decision concerning Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, the Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and conditions to the Certificate of Environmental Compatibility; and
- 10. Adjournment.
